HEALTHCARE BASED ON IMMIGRATION STATUS AND NATIONAL ORIGIN

Undocumented immigrants are not eligible for certain public benefits, including Medicaid, SNAP, and TANF. However, some states have implemented policies to provide certain public benefits to undocumented immigrants who meet the state's residency requirements. The following table provides information on the public benefits available to undocumented immigrants in New Jersey.

SNAP

SNAP is a federal program that provides food assistance to low-income individuals and families. In New Jersey, SNAP is available to undocumented immigrants who meet the state's residency requirements and are not receiving any other federal benefits.

Medicaid

Medicaid is a state and federal program that provides health coverage to low-income individuals and families. In New Jersey, Medicaid is available to undocumented immigrants who meet the state's residency requirements and are not receiving any other federal benefits.

TANF

TANF is a state and federal program that provides cash assistance to low-income individuals and families. In New Jersey, TANF is available to undocumented immigrants who meet the state's residency requirements and are not receiving any other federal benefits.

Public Housing

Public housing is a federal program that provides affordable housing to low-income individuals and families. In New Jersey, public housing is available to undocumented immigrants who meet the state's residency requirements and are not receiving any other federal benefits.

Other Public Benefits

Other public benefits available to undocumented immigrants in New Jersey include:

- Food stamps
- Child care subsidies
- Job training programs
- Subsidized housing
- State-funded health care programs
